CLEAN CITY RESERVOIR

Water Superintendent Gillman cleaned the city reservoir yesterday, and today water users may again sprinkle their lawns and water the gardens. The work of cleaning the reservoir was much easier than has been the case heretofore. Mr. Gillman has placed a gate valve in the main about 150 feet below the reservoir, and a few feet from the valve on the lower side he tapped the main and attached a two-inch pipe leading back to the reservoir. With hose and nozzle he able to utilize the pressure in the main to silt out the reservoir, the gate valve being closed.
