O. R. & N. IN A CAR SUIT

The first suit filed in Oregon against the O. R. & N. company under the provisions of the new law passed by the last legislature giving a shipper damages for failure on the part of the railroad company to supply cars when demanded was filed in the circuit court for Umatilla county yesterday, says the Pendleton Tribune. The plaintiffs in the case are Martin & Riggs, a co-partnership doing business at Milton, and the defendant is the O. R. & N. company.

The complaint alleges that last fall the plaintiffs were in the fruit business in Milton, and maintained there a warehouse and engaged in buying and shipping fruit. They, it is alleged, had entered into a contract with a firm in Kansas City to supply certain number of boxes of apples and other fruits within a certain period of time. While this contract was in effect, they were unable to obtain the cars at Milton or Freewater, for 19 refrigerator cars, then for four, then for one and at different times for one, two and three cars.

The railroad company failed to provide the cars upon the 19 days' written request and as a result the plaintiffs allege that the Kansas City firm cancelled and annulled the contract on the grounds that the shipments were not being made as the contract called for. As a result the plaintiffs allege that they lost \$6314.50, for which they ask judgment against the defendant railroad company. They also ask for \$1000 attorney fees. The attorney for the plaintiffs resides at Boise.

Under the law under which this suit is brought a railroad company upon written 19 days' request by a shipper must supply the cars asked for or be subjected to damages for any loss the shipper might have sustained by reason of failure so to do. The legislature passed this act to do away with the delay occasioned to shippers by the apparent inability or neglect of the railroad company in furnishing cars.

ROBBERY AT PENDLETON.

After Visit to La Grande, Helix Farmer Gets Touched in Wheat Town.

George Hewitt, the well known Helix farmer, who has been in the city several days from La Grande, where he has been living for the past five months, was robbed of \$300 in money by some party known to him, who accompanied him to his room in the State hotel at the corner of Webb and Cottonwood streets, at 1 o'clock last night.

Mr. Hewitt was about the city last evening and intended to go to La Grande on the 4:40 train, but owing to his inability to get his baggage to the depot he did not go, and during the evening was about the streets with a "friend" who accompanied him to his room.

Mr. Hewitt was under the influence of liquor but remembers distinctly who the party was who accompanied him and it is almost certain that the police will apprehend the thief.—Pendleton East Oregonian.

Walla Wallans Want Money.
