DIRECTOR SWORN IN

DAVID BAY IS NEW PRESIDENT OF BOARD.

Formal Meeting Held by Members of the School Board Last Evening—President Ivanhoe Retires, Mr. Bay Steps In and the New Director, W. L. Brenholts is Sworn in—New Teacher.

Formalities characterized the special meeting of the La Grande school board meeting last evening. The meeting was called to canvass the election returns of the recent vote to elect a successor to Col. F. S. Ivanhoe, and this done, there was a formal shifting, in which the retiring president of the board, F. S. Ivanhoe, stepped down, David Bay assumed the presidency, and W. L. Brenholts was given the oath of office. These changes followed the canvass of votes at which Mr. Ivanhoe presided. Immediately afterward, Mr. Brenholts was sworn in and the new president seated. Mr. Bay is the oldest member of the board in point of service, and for this reason was entitled to the chair. His reign will end one year from now, when the next oldest member takes the seat.

Some Business Done.
While the meeting was a purely formal one, and came to an end as promptly as possible to allow members of the board who are councilmen, to keep both engagements, there was nevertheless steps taken touching upon the school faculty. Miss Sarah Riddle's resignation was presented and accepted. Her place will be filled by Lydia Hug of South La Grande.

Meet Again Friday.
Next Friday night the board meets in regular session. At that time bids will be opened for completing the upper story of the brick structure in North La Grande. This will be the principal business to come before that meeting.

Big Deal at Baker City.
A farm site of 200 acres of the most productive land in eastern Oregon was made in Baker City yesterday, the deal being promoted by Calvin & Mitchell, the Center street real estate dealers.

The farm in question is what has been known for several years as the W. W. Travillion place, situated just outside the northern limits of the city. It is growing timothy and alfalfa, which finds a ready market in the city on account of its close proximity and short haul by team.

A. E. Whittier is the lucky purchaser, and he plunked down the \$18,000 as the buying price, or \$90 per acre. Mr. Whittier is a prominent sheep owner of this county and will likely establish winter quarters for his band on his new purchase.

Judge Travillion came into possession of the land he has just disposed of many years ago at a price that probably did not exceed \$10 per acre. —Baker City Democrat.
