## "BABES" TAKE PRISONERS IN

Walla Walla, June 22.—(Special)—The La Grande Babes played two games here yesterday, winning both. During the morning, the strong penitentiary team was taken in tow to the tune of 5 to 1. The striped team up the hill is a fast bunch and during the game the few spectators got an excellent line on what the league team had to bump up against when the afternoon game came around. Almost perfect ball was exhibited on both sides, but the La Grande clouters won out by consistent hitting. Big "Zip" Zimmerman did the twirling for the Babes and his playmates say he never threw better in his life. Though out of the regular schedule, the game was a fine one and when the score became known there was a general sinking of hearts among Walla Walla fans, for the prisoners are recognized as a fast aggregation.

## ELGIN TRAIN LATE TWO DAYS

A temporary schedule governed the running time of the passenger train of the Elgin branch today and will continue in effect until after tomorrow. This morning the train was held up on account of power shortage, and did not leave until 10:30, because the westbound train was delayed. Tomorrow the Elgin train leaves at 9:30 and will return at 5:30. The regular schedule becomes effective after tomorrow.

### Rain in Umatilla.

Rain from Hermiston to Milton yesterday, says the Pendleton Tribune.

To be sure it wasn't a heavy rain, but then it was a dampness and is encouraging.

While in Pendleton and below the city the rainfall was very light, yet reports from up in the wheat belt around Athena and Weston and to the south on the reservation are to the effect that the rain was very heavy. And that was just where the rain would do the most good. Below town the wheat is too far gone, but out this other way it was still battling valiantly for life, and this little rain helped it out wonderfully.

Some ranchers from the upper country were so sanguine over yesterday's rainfall that they said they would have a good crop if it did not rain another drop this summer. However, that condition is only local, as there are many others who will not get any sort of a crop.

Reports from Walla Walla and Wallula say that it rained in that section yesterday nearly all day, which means that if it rained at Wallula, it also rained at Juniper Springs and along Juniper canyon, where there is considerable wheat which was not too far gone to be revived and made into 40-bushel stuff.

"We don't care whether it rains in Pendleton or not," said a resident last night, "just so long as it rains in the wheat belt." And that's the way they all feel about it.

### Farmers Build Railroad.

Over in Crook county the inhabitants have reached the stage of desperation where people get out with picks, shovels and scrapers and build their own railroad in order to get crops to the markets. This is the course that has been adopted by the business men and farmers of Bend, Prineville, Madras and other points. With an initial capital of \$50,000 they propose to construct a railroad from Shanika, the Columbia Southern terminus, to Bend, 90 miles.—Portland Journal.
