**MASS MEETING TO DECIDE CANNERY QUESTION JULY 4TH**

**BOARD OF MANAGERS TAKE STEPS TO PROCURE DESIRABLE ENTERPRIZE AS ANNOUNCED HERETOFORE**

**WANT WIDE PUBLICITY FOR IRRIGATION SCHEME**

Several matters of importance came up before the board of managers of the Commercial club at their meeting last night. The cannery proposition was discussed, but will be left in abeyance until after the Fourth, when a meeting between the orchardists of the valley, the farmers who own land under the proposed irrigation ditch and the Commercial club of this city. It is necessary to interest the fruit-growers in the cannery, and it is thought that a mass meeting is the best way to reach all of them. As for the irrigation scheme, both farmers and orchardists are vitally interested in that, and it is desired to give the project the greatest possible amount of publicity in the shortest possible

time. One of the objects of the meeting also, is to discuss the matter of securing adequate transportation facilities, or at least a promise from the railroad company of a sufficient number of cars to handle the products of our farms and orchards. Concerted action on the part of producers is likely to accomplish a great deal more than any number of complaints from individuals. About a dozen applications for the place of secretary to the club were considered, but it was decided to wait until the literature is about ready for distribution before employing anyone. Other matters were talked over in a general way.

Huntington this morning. So complete is the congestion at that place, that trains are made up on the main line and sent out as fast as the power supply in the La Grande round house will permit. Engines are brought in, and by reason of the modern equipment in the local round house, can be sent out again in a very few hours. This happened today when 367 came in shortly after 7 o'clock and was sent out again before 10 o'clock. Passenger engines are drafted into freight service to help matters. The mass of freight at Huntington means approximately 21 trains that will pass through La Grande before the congestion is cleared.

Though the O. R. & N. has an abundance of power standing idle, the officials are reluctant about setting them up, as they figure the present strenuous rush of business to be but temporary. The end is in sight in fact, as scattering passenger trains and some delayed freight trains are all that are marked up to go over the O. R. & N. tracks from the Northern Pacific. The flood damage in Montana has been remedied and things are moving along the regular lines now, except such trains as were headed for the O. R. & N. before the repairs were made.

**ADVERTISING FOR FEDERAL BUILDING SITES.**

Treasury Department, Office of the Secretary, Washington, D. C., June 8, 1908.

Proposals will be received, to be opened at 2 o'clock p. m., July 13, 1908, for the sale or donation to the United States of a suitable site, centrally and conveniently located, for the federal building to be erected in La Grande, Oregon. A corner lot, of (approximately) 130x135 feet, is required. Each proposal must give the price, the character of foundations obtainable, the proximity to street cars, sewer, gas and water mains, etc., and must be accompanied by a diagram indicating the principal street, the north point, the dimensions and grades of the land, the widths and paving of adjacent streets and alleys, whether the alleys are public or private, and whether or not the city owns land occupied by sidewalks. The vendor must pay all expenses connected with furnishing evidences of title and deeds of conveyance. Improvements on the property must be reserved by the vendor; but pending the commencement of the federal building they may remain on the land upon payment of a reasonable ground rent. The grantor must, however, remove all improvements on thirty days' notice so to do. The right to reject any proposal is reserved. Each proposal must be sealed, marked "Proposal for federal building site at La Grande, Oregon," and mailed to the secretary of the treasury, (supervising architect), Washington, D. C. No special form of proposal is required or provided.
