THE KINDLY SHEPPARD

Adna Rogers, John Williamson, Oscar Coolidge and Prof. Hockenberry returned last night from a trip to the upper waters of the Grande Ronde, where they went to look after the timber claims of Coolidge, Rogers and Hockenberry. But that is not the point of the story.

Tuesday, while passing over the mountain between Fly creek and Sheep creek, the party heard the plaintive bleatings of a deserted lamb. After some search the little thing was found lying helpless in a hole, its mother probably destroyed by coyotes. Adna Rogers has long wanted to own some sheep, and the chance was not to be neglected. With the help of Mr. Coolidge the lamb was rescued, and during the day fed upon condensed milk, two parts water and one of milk, sugar added in suitable quantities. It is not of record that the lamb was consulted as to the amount of sugar, but Mr. Rogers is familiar with the formula. At bedtime the lamb was taken into the bed with its rescuers and so kept from perishing with cold. Becoming hungry during the night as all young creatures are apt to do, the lamb demanded food in so strenuous a manner that Rogers was constrained to arise and prepare its bottle. Whether Mr. Coolidge also arose we do not know, but that the process of administering food to the lamb required the combined services of both its rescuers, we are assured. Lamb, when approached with the bottle, would back away as far as possible, until some obstruction in the rear stopped it. Then with Mr. Coolidge holding the animal, head to the wind, so to speak, Rogers would force it to drink. The tender care given the little thing kept it alive, and it now grazes the pasture surrounding Mr. Rogers' home on Second street.

Back to Old Schedule.

Until engine 118 is taken off the Durkee work train, which will perhaps be tomorrow, the Elgin train will continue to run on the special schedule. Since Sunday the passenger to Elgin has been waiting for the west-bound passenger, and consequently it has been between 10 and 11 o'clock each day before the train gets under way. The logging train continues to leave here at 3 o'clock in the morning, returning for the George Palmer mill in time to make the second trip out with the passenger train.
