### "COYOTE BILL" UNDER ARREST.

Officers at Asotin Charge Cattle Stealing in Grande Ronde.

Asotin, Wash., June 25.—William Cottingham, better known as "Coyote Bill," and his brother-in-law, Scott Clark, Jr., were arrested last night by ex-Sheriff Robert Richards and Deputy W. C. Martin on a charge of stealing cattle in the Grande Ronde country. J. C. Brown, a wealthy stockman of Walla Walla county, Oregon, preferred the charges.

Cottingham is an old offender, having spent some time in the state penitentiary at Walla Walla for stealing horses. Clark is the son of a wealthy stockman and has heretofore borne a good reputation.

Brown owns large herds of cattle, which graze in both Washington and Oregon, and while the officers claim to have a good case against Cottingham, it has not been determined whether the crime was committed in Oregon or Washington, so that no requisition papers will be sought under this charge until the case has been investigated. Prosecuting Attorney M. P. Shaughnessy has charge of the case and says he has secured new evidence, in addition to that which caused the arrest of the men.

### Umatilla Wheat Crop.

That much of the depression that has visited the ranchers of Umatilla county and business men of Pendleton since it was reported that crops would be a failure or practically so, is shown by the results of an inspection of the wheat fields made yesterday by W. P. Temple of this city. His conclusions, far from supporting the pessimistic opinions of many who were not informed at first hand, show that even without any more rain the crop will be of fair size, while if rains occur, a one of normal proportion will result. Without rain, from 20 to 30 bushels an acre will be realized, while with moisture from 25 to 40 bushels may be anticipated.—Pendleton Tribune.

### Road to Wallowa in 40 Days.

E. A. Holmes, while in Portland, held several interviews with General Manager O'Brien and Engineer Buckley, and they assured him that the railroad will be completed to this city in 40 days, says the Wallowa Sun. When Mr. Holmes returned Monday, a carload of laborers came down from Portland to begin work. The temporary bridge across the Looking Glass creek was completed and the material for bridges and track was rushed to the front.
