FIGHT ON IN EARNEST

Pendleton, June 26.—The East Oregonian said last night.

Whether or not the prohibition vote cast in the recent election shall be upheld is now being tried out in circuit court and by this evening or tomorrow morning the problem will be up to Judge Bean.

This morning District Attorney Phelps in behalf of the state, filed his answer denying all the principal allegations of the amended complaint in the Nolte case. Thereupon the case became at issue and about 10:30 this forenoon County Clerk Frank Saling was called as the first witness for the liquor men.

The principal point which the plaintiffs wished to show by the clerk evidently was that he had not one regular deputy some one other than the first deputy. However, the witness declared that Clark Nelson, who checked the names, was at that time the one and only regularly authorized deputy in the office. Chief Clerk R. T. Brown being then out upon a campaigning tour.

County Clerk Frank Saling was upon the stand for two hours and he was followed by Deputy Brown. Sheriff Taylor was then called to the stand about 2 o'clock this afternoon.

An objection to the sheriff's testifying in the case was made by District Attorney Phelps, who quoted the statute to the effect that the sheriff's return shall be prima facie evidence that the election notices were legally posted. The objection was sustained by Judge Bean, but the plaintiffs were allowed to ask the questions they desired and the questions and answers were taken into the record for use in case of an appeal.

At 3 o'clock this afternoon Sheriff Taylor was still upon the stand.

The legal battle now on is being fought by Messrs. Winter, Richards and Lowell for the saloon men, while Mr. Phelps is making a single-handed fight for the county and state.

ADVERTISING FOR FEDERAL BUILDING SITES.

Treasury Department, Office of the Secretary, Washington, D. C., June 8, 1908.

Proposals will be received, to be opened at 2 o'clock p. m., July 16, 1908, for the sale or donation to the United States of a suitable site, centrally and conveniently located, for the federal building to be erected in La Grande, Oregon. A corner lot, of (approximately) 120x155 feet, is required. Each proposal must give the price, the character of foundations obtainable, the proximity to street cars, sewer, gas and water mains, etc., and must be accompanied by a diagram indicating the principal street, the north point, the dimensions and grades of the land, the widths and paving of adjacent streets and alleys, whether the alleys are public or private, and whether or not the city owns land occupied by sidewalks. The vendor must pay all expenses connected with furnishing evidences of title and deeds of conveyance. Improvements on the property must be reserved by the vendor; but pending the commencement of the federal building they may remain on the land upon payment of a reasonable ground rent. The grantor must, however, remove all improvements on thirty days' notice so to do. The right to reject any proposal is reserved. Each proposal must be sealed, marked "Proposal for federal building site at La Grande, Oregon," and mailed to the secretary of the treasury, (supervising architect), Washington, D. C. No special form of proposal is required or provided.
