**Ordinance No. 288, Series 1908.**  
An ordinance regulating the storage of gunpowder, giant powder, dynamite, nitro-glycerine, oil and other combustible materials.  
The City of La Grande does ordain as follows:  
Section 1. That no person, persons, firm or corporation shall store, or cause or permit to be stored, or keep for sale within the corporate limits of the City of La Grande, Oregon, any nitro-glycerine or dynamite, nor more than 100 pounds of Judson blasting powder, which must at all times be kept in metal cans, and stored in a basement or vault and placed near the door thereof, nor more than 100 pounds of giant powder, and ten boxes of caps for the same, to be kept in a vault underground, outside of the building; provided, however, that said giant powder shall be stored at a distance of at least 100 feet from any other powder, and at least 25 feet from the giant powder caps; provided, further, that it shall be lawful to store or keep for sale, in any brick or stone store or warehouse, not more than 50 pounds of gunpowder at any one time, which must at all times be kept in metal cans.

Section 2. That no person or persons, firm or corporation shall store, or cause to be stored, or keep for sale within the city, in a larger quantity than 100 gallons, which must at all times be kept in metal cans, in any one building or upon any premises or street, any gasoline or other product of petroleum, unless the same be kept in an iron tank or in metal cans stored in a brick or stone building or warehouse, not more than one-story in height, and in every respect fireproof, and which building or warehouse or iron tank shall be used for, and devoted only to the storage of gasoline and other products of petroleum, and shall have painted outside on the front thereof, in plain letters, at least 6 inches in length, the words, "For the storage of Gasoline," and in no case be situated or located within the city, except upon the permission of the authorities hereinafter named.

Section 3.—That it is hereby made the duty of the chief engineer of the fire department, the chief of police, and the chairman of the committee of fire and police, and each and all of them, to see that the requirements of this ordinance are strictly enforced, and to grant permission mentioned in section 2, if they find, after investigation, that such permission should be granted.

Section 4. Any person, partnership, or officer or officers, or manager or managers, of any corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than \$50.00, nor more than \$200.00, or by imprisonment in the city jail not less than 15 days nor more than 100 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the recorder.

Section 5. That inasmuch as there is no ordinance at present, in regard to the storage of the materials described and mentioned herein, and in order to secure the safety of the inhabitants of the city and the property therein, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and take effect from and after its approval by the mayor, and the publication thereof in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer.

Passed by the common council on the 17th day of June, 1908, by seven members voting therefor.
