POSITION IN POST OFFICE

The United States civil service commission announces that an examination for the positions of male clerk, female clerk, and carrier will be held at La Grande, Oregon, July 11, 1908, for the purpose of establishing eligible registers from which selections may be made to fill a vacancy in the position of sub-carrier. It is expected that there will be a vacancy in the position of female clerk at \$400.00 per annum at an early date. Selection will be made from the female clerk register to be established from the examination of July 11 to fill this vacancy. Applicants must be not less than 18 years of age nor more than 45 years on the date of the examination. Male applicants must be at least 5 feet 4 inches in height in bare feet, and weight not less than 125 pounds without hat or overcoat. Persons desiring to compete should at once apply to Miss Mary L. Riesland, P. O., the secretary of the local board of civil service examiners, for application blanks and information concerning the scope of the examination.

RESTORATION TO ENTRY OF LANDS IN NATIONAL FOREST.
