THE WEEKLY NEWS LETTER

Portland, June 29.—(Special correspondence.)—There is an intense competition between the different communities of Oregon in issuing attractive and convincing literature. Many of the publications circulated to draw attention to this state today are superior to the most ambitious product of the metropolitan printers 10 years ago. Up to the present time the most artistic booklet printed in the state is one just gotten out by the Yamhill County Development league. Its reproductions of raspberries, cherries, prunes and grapes are done in natural colors, and like the picture in the old fable, would almost deceive the birds.

Secretary W. L. Crissey of the Oregon State Dairy association, has ready for circulation the report of that body for the past year. It is very much the most comprehensive report which has appeared concerning any dairy meeting on the Pacific coast, and Mr. Crissey will furnish copy to anyone interested, upon request. Oregon has grown wonderfully in fruit, agriculture and general industries, but dairying holds the record for greatest increase, dairy products having risen from a value of \$5,000,000 annually five years ago to \$17,000,000 in 1907.

The Dallas business men have invited the business men of Portland to attend their "Cherry carnival" Wednesday, July 1, and many people will make the trip from this city, either by boat or rail.

An intensely interesting meeting vital to the future of Portland, Ore., and the northwest, is called for tomorrow at the convention hall of the Portland commercial club. Transportation questions of deepest moment to this section will be discussed.

Portland's excursion to Eugene was one of the most successful and delightful events that ever took place in this state. The Portlanders had a choir along, which sang:

"A Lane county drink
We are willing to buy.
What do they drink
In a county that's dry?"
Innumerable equally effective verses enlivened the journey.

When the National Association of Retail Grocers of the United States meets in Portland next year, special trains from various parts of the country will be a feature. One is already planned by the merchants of Cincinnati, another from Chicago, while Boston has organized a "Portland club" and they will charter their own car.

CHANCE FOR LAND RUSH

While it is possible that there will be a land office rush similar to those which were seen here last summer, it is not likely that the filling on Blue Mountain national forest lands in the La Grande United States land office next Wednesday will be the cause of a very noticeable rush. There are large areas of this land to be thrown open on next Wednesday morning at 9 o'clock, as the past month has been set aside for settlement on these tracts of land. The land is located in the Blue Mountain national forest, not far from La Grande.

It is believed that there are already some here to gain early admittance to the office when the doors are thrown open on that date, but as yet nothing has leaked out that there will be anything to resemble the rush of last summer.

ADVERTISING FOR FEDERAL BUILDING SITES.

Treasury Department, Office of the Secretary, Washington, D. C., June 3, 1908.

Proposals will be received, to be opened at 2 o'clock p. m., July 16, 1908, for the sale or donation to the United States of a suitable site, centrally an inconveniently located, for the federal building to be erected in La Grande, Oregon. A corner lot, of (approximately) 130x135 feet, is required. Each proposal must give the price, the character of foundations obtainable, the proximity to street bars, sewer, gas and water mains, etc., and must be accompanied by a diagram indicating the principal street, the north point, the dimensions and grades of the land, the widths and paving of adjacent streets and alleys, whether the alleys are public or private, and whether or not the city owns land occupied by sidewalks. The vendor must pay all expenses connected with furnishing evidences of title and deeds of conveyance. Improvements on the property must be reserved by the vendor; but pending the commencement of the federal building they may remain on the land upon payment of a reasonable ground rent. The grantor must, however, remove all improvements on thirty days' notice so to do. The right to reject any proposal is reserved. Each proposal must be sealed, marked "Proposal for federal building site at La Grande, Oregon," and mailed to the secretary of the treasury, (supervising architect), Washington, D. C. No special form of proposal is required or provided.
