BUILDING THE ARBOR

Carpenters under supervision of Street Superintendent Matott today commenced the construction of the arbor to be used during the four days' celebration here, commencing July 1, as a rest place and general headquarters for the Fourth. The affair is to be 75x66 feet. Clean new planks will form the seating capacity for an even 1000. At one end will be the rostrum on which the speakers and singers of the day will stand. The entire seating capacity is to be thoroughly covered with boughs so as to keep out rain and afford a shady place in which the visitors to the city on that day can rest. The arbor will be located in the vacant lot adjoining the Buzzini building.
