HARVEST STARTS MONDAY.

Umatilla Wheat Crop Will Be Much Better Than Rumors Have Had It.

The hum of at least 20 combined harvesters will open the harvest season in Umatilla county next Monday morning, July 6, and from that date until the last crop is harvested the machines will be kept at work, relates the Pendleton East Oregonian.

In the northwest part of the county in what is known as the "light land" district, about 10 harvesters will start next Monday and an equal number will also be started in the vicinity of Pilot Rock. Among those to start in the northwest part of the county are Hans Lorenzen, Henry Lorenzen, Andy Peebler and others, while J. A. Gurdarian, James Agee, Alvin Wade and Jerome Stonebreaker, will start in the south part of the county. Grain sacks have been taken out

this week by most of these farmers, and everything is in readiness for the beginning of active operations next Monday morning.

In both of these localities farmers say that the wheat is better than they had expected to find it after the long dry spell of weather and a good, average crop will be harvested.

The prices of grain sacks this week are 6 cents for old sacks and 7 1/2 for new.

Increase Parcels Post.

Washington, June 30.—After today, under a parcels post agreement with Great Britain, parcels up to a weight limit of eleven pounds may be mailed to England, Scotland and Ireland. Postmaster General Meyer believes that this will materially increase the number of parcels sent to the United Kingdom and from the countries composing it to the United States. At the present time, a package weighing in excess of four pounds six ounces cannot be sent in the mails in the United Kingdom.

There are now thirty-three foreign countries with which we have parcel post conventions; with nine, the weight limit is four pounds six ounces, and with twenty-four it is eleven pounds. It is the intention to make the maximum weight eleven pounds in all countries.

Owing to the objections of the express companies, however, this weight limit will not apply to points within the United States.

Lawyer to Women Only.

New York, June 30.—Believing that a woman is better able to understand the attitude of women toward legal problems and to aid them in obtaining justice through the courts Mrs. Annie W. Hochfelder, attorney at law, will tomorrow open a downtown office and hang out a shingle reading, "Women clients only." So far as known, she is the pioneer in her field and the only attorney who will refuse retainers from mere men.

Mrs. Hochfelder was a school teacher before she married Julius Hochfelder, a prominent attorney who is the author of several legal works. After her marriage she entered the law school of New York University. There will be no rivalry in the family, as Mr. Hochfelder's clients are practically all men.

Must Mark Shipments.

Pittsburg, Pa., June 30.—All railroads east of the Mississippi, in the territory covered by the "official classification," will after today refuse to accept for transportation all shipments in less than carload lots which are not plainly marked with the name of the consignee and the station, city and state of destination. For many years it has been customary for a large number of shippers to mark their packages with an initial or some hieroglyphic, the key to which would be on the bill of lading. It was the theory that this saved time and also prevented competitors from observing the names of a shipper's customers on the outside of packages.
