**FIRST LAP FINISHED.**

Walla Walla Paper Gives Out Dope on Inland Empire League.

With the close of the series of games between Baker City and Walla Walla on the local grounds, the first lap in the Inland Empire league race has been completed and shows La Grande to have a comfortable lead over the other three clubs, which, however, are closely bunched. Walla Walla in second place, relates the Walla Walla Bulletin. All teams have now played two series with each of the other clubs in the circuit, one of them at home and the other in the enemy's country.

Starting out the season with four straight victories over Baker City's team which at that time was a very weak aggregation, La Grande has succeeded in keeping quite a bit ahead of the other members of the organization. But of late the other clubs have been engaged in strengthening and from now on the Babes are going to have to hustle. Walla Walla has done the best of any of the three cities against the leaders, having won two of the seven games, and still having an opportunity of bettering this record in the event that she can take the postponed game yet to be played with them in this city.

Pendleton comes here tomorrow for a series continuing up to and including Sunday, while La Grande will play Baker City on the latter's grounds. Should the Nuggets succeed in taking three out of four from the leaders and at the same time the Garden City aggregation should do the same to the shepherders, things would grow intensely interesting in this locality.

Walla Walla, on dope, looks as strong as any team in the league for the coming fray. French, the hard-hitting center fielder, will be back in his old position tomorrow, after having to lay off for several contests on account of an injury received while running bases. Dutcher is showing up satisfactorily at third, while Harmon has been moved to the outfield where his great ground covering abilities can be used to the greatest advantage and where he will probably be able to do greater work with the stick. Our pitchers, Anderson and Ehmke are working nicely and Killlay is being counted upon to get his share of the "wins," as soon as his hand gets well. White behind the bat is a star and has done much to keep the team in the running. The remainder of the club are doing their best and are backing up the pitchers in strong style, both in the field and at the bat.
