

# STREET CARS IN PENDLETON

Pendleton, July 3.—The Tribune said yesterday:

A street railway system for Pendleton with a line connecting with the Columbia river and other lines radiating from this city to adjacent territory is the plan of the committee of citizens who last night applied to the city council for a franchise.

The capitalists back of the project are the same Pittsburg people who built the line from Boise to Caldwell, in Idaho, and their engineer was in

Pendleton about a month ago, spent two weeks here, and reported very favorably to his principals.

James H. Gwinn, who presented the ordinance to the council last evening said in explanation, that it was asked for as a preliminary step in the work of getting the capitalists interested in this field, and to get them interested the citizens must have something to show and something to offer. He said the engineer who had been here had reported favorably.

Monte B. Gwinn later appeared before the council and the talk he gave them was something that made them sit up and take notice. He explained that the same people who would eventually take over the franchise if the road was built were the people who had constructed the line from Boise to Caldwell and of which he had been one of the early promoters, and was still a stockholder. So favorable had been the report of their engineer on

the Pendleton field that he felt confident they would be willing to take up the construction of this system, and the franchise was requested in order that they might have something to offer. The main idea, he said, was to get a line from Pendleton to the Columbia river. What such a line would do for the country was to be seen in the rapid increase and growth of such places as Freewater and Milton and the Boise valley, and other places in the Willamette valley.

"These men are Pittsburg capitalists," said Mr. Gwinn, "and they have the money to put into the system and are, I believe, favorable to the Pendleton proposition. When they build a road they build a good one, just as good as the O. R. & N. track. We are not asking for an exclusive franchise, and in the meantime if any one else should come in with the money to build this system, we would say, 'Let them have it.' What we are working for is the good of Pendleton and Umatilla county and we want a railroad of this character if possible."

### LIKES DRY TOWN.

Comes to Pendleton Because it Went Dry—Likes It.

The first business man to come to Pendleton to engage permanently in business here because the town and county went "dry" at the recent election is J. H. Ledgate of North Yakima, who has leased the Golden Rule dining room and will convert it into a first-class restaurant at once, says the East Oregonian.

Mr. and Mrs. Ledgate will have immediate charge of the business and being experienced restaurant people, will make improvements and add attractions to the place and hope to enjoy a share of the patronage of the city and adjacent country.

The deal for the lease of the restaurant was consummated last evening and today the new proprietors took charge and will begin business at that popular place, believing that prohibition will help, rather than injure Pendleton.

J. Popejoy will continue in charge of the hotel, but hereafter will have nothing to do with the dining room or restaurant department.
