COVE LOSES MUCH TALKED OF GAME.

Two Games at Elgin Yesterday Are Main Attractions of the Celebration -About 5000 Attend-Union Spent a Quiet Day-Pierce Orator of the Day at Elgin.

Elgin, July 6 .- (Special.) -- Notwithstanding that there were close to 5000 people in Elgin last Saturday to attend the best Fourth of July celebration in the history of the city, and that there was a varied lot of attractions, the chief interest centered in the ball game between Cove and Eigin for a side bet of \$100. The game was pulled off in the morning to allow the Elgin team to play its double-header, closing the baseball attractions of the day with Union during the afternoon. Interest had run high in the Cove-Elgin game, and it is no wonder that thousands saw the game. The side bet was but a trifle compared to the sum total of small amounts which changed hands on the outcome of the contest. Elgin won, 6 to 8.

In the afternoon the Eigin team again covered itself with victory by defeating the Union team, 14 to 12. Hon. Walter M. Pierce was the ora tor of the day here.

Union, July 6 .- (Special.) -Inhabitants of Union Saturday divided itself between La Grande, Elgin and Baker City. Those coming back from any of these places speak highly of the elaborateness of the celebrations, but those who saw the monster parade at La Grande are profuse in their praise.

Union was pratically deserted, but those who did remain here for the day, found some entertainment in game of baseball between two sets of business men.
