

ACCIDENT AT BAKER

Briggs Schultz, Elsie Emily and Miss Garner together with the driver, from the float to the street, seriously injuring Mrs. Truesdale, who was taken to the hospital; Laura Hill, Mrs. Briggs Schultz, Mr. Ayers. We could not ascertain how seriously the victims of the deplorable accident were hurt, but it is enough to say that it is most distressing and that after working so faithfully and patriotically to decorate their float in anticipation of their participation in the parade. We regret the accident more than we can tell and trust that the injured ones will speedily recover and mingle once again with their friends whose sympathy they have to the fullest extent. The team was stopped near the hospital and did not appear in the procession.

'NEAR-BEER' FOR PENDLETON.

Walla Walla Brewers Will Furnish Mock Boozie.

Pendleton will not be "dry" today. Not by any manner of means, for by the time the afternoon train pulls out for the Oregon city which has been held in death-like grip by the demon, Thirst, for the past two days, there will be ample quantity of "near-beer" on the platform at the O. R. & N. depot, consigned to soft drink dealers there, says the Walla Walla Union.

It will be good news to the Oregonians, without doubt, but Pendleton will not be alone in her enjoyment of the "made in Walla Walla" product, for it is the intention to supply all cities in Oregon where there is apt to be a call for the new non-intoxicating beverage.

The carbonating machinery ordered some time ago by the Betz Brewing company, arrived in the city yesterday, and is being set up preparatory to manufacturing a large amount of "near-beer" this forenoon.

The head brewers of the two local establishments recently returned from the east, where they went to take instruction as to the manufacture of the new beverage, and it is reported that the new machinery will be placed in operation early tomorrow morning.

But little, if any, of the prohibition drink is to be sold in Walla Walla, for the reason that it might tend to injure the business of local liquor dealers who are required to secure a license for the sale of the ordinary beer. That local people would welcome the new drink has been evident from the number of telephone calls which have been received by the two breweries during the past two weeks, asking for information as to when the manufacture of "near-beer" was to be taken up in Walla Walla.

Russians Coming.

Weston, July 4.—There are a number of Russians coming in from the Walla Walla country at this time. They are negotiating for lands on the Weston mountain summit, and many of them will locate there. It is understood that these people propose to establish their own schools and a Greek church on the mountains.
