UMATILLA CROPS GOOD.

Wheat in Dry County Will Be Up to Usual Standard.

A conservative estimate of this year's wheat crop in Umatilla county, and a sane view of the conditions is given by Will Moore, the well known representative of the Pacific Coast Elevator company, says the Pendleton Tribune. Mr. Moore, within the past few days, has been over a large part of the wheat section of the county.

"We will not have as much wheat as we have had in some years past, and we will have more than we have had in some other years," said Mr. Moore yesterday. "We are going to have a lot more wheat than most people think. It is entirely too early to attempt an estimate of the total yield in bushels for the weather conditions between now and time to harvest will make a great different. The wheat is not all past danger, neither is it past help. The weather will play an important part."

"Of course, down in the lower country the damage is considerable, but still, even there, it is not as bad as it might be and not as bad as I have seen it. Through the upper section there is plenty of good wheat and opportunity for big yields with favorable weather, even yet. But as I said, we are going to have a lot more wheat than people think we are, and conditions, although a little dubious, are not nearly so bad as they have been in years past, nor as bad as they might be. I think more of Umatilla county this year than ever before."

ADVERTISING FOR FEDERAL BUILDING SITES.

Treasury Department, Office of the Secretary, Washington, D. C., June 8, 1908.

Proposals will be received, to be opened at 2 o'clock p. m., July 16, 1908, for the sale or donation to the United States of a suitable site, centrally and conveniently located, for the federal building to be erected in La Grande, Oregon. A corner lot, of

(approximately) 130x125 feet, is required. Each proposal must give the price, the character of foundations obtainable, the proximity to street cars, sewer, gas and water mains, etc., and must be accompanied by a diagram indicating the principal street, the north point, the dimensions and grades of the land, the widths and paving of adjacent streets and alleys, whether the alleys are public or private, and whether or not the city owns land occupied by sidewalks. The vendor must pay all expenses connected with furnishing evidences of title and deeds of conveyance. Improvements on the property must be reserved by the vendor; but pending the commencement of the federal building they may remain on the land upon payment of a reasonable ground rent. The grantor must, however, remove all improvements on thirty days' notice so to do. The right to reject any proposal is reserved. Each proposal must be sealed, marked "Proposal for federal building site at La Grande, Oregon,"

and mailed to the secretary of the treasury, (supervising architect), Washington, D. C. No special form of proposal is required or provided.
