FEWER POLICEMEN.

"Dry" Pendleton Has Little Use for Present Size Department.

Though no action has yet been takn by the council, it is the intention of the police committee to reduce the size of the police force and after the first of the month the number of officers will be lessened by at least one man, says the Pendleton East Oregonian.

At present there are two day men Chief of Police Gurdane and Officer Scheer, while the night work is done by Officers John and Clarence Kearney. It is now the intention to do with but one day man in the future. but it is regarded as unsafe to reduce the number of night men at present Since prohibition went into effect here there has really been "little doing" for the police. But one solitary drunk has been taken, he being the man found at the corner of Webb and Main streets the day after the celebration at Walla Walla.
