An illustration of the important work of repair being done on the mountain by the O. R. & N. company was given to this city today when 20 carloads of stone, some of the massive pieces weighing four tons, passed through to be dumped into the Umatilla river at the steel bridge west of the city, says the Pendleton East Ore-

The steam shovel is located at Allen spur, 35 mlles east of the city and there a half dozen work trains are engaged in hauling rock to fill in the washouts caused by last spring's high water. Rock weighing from one to four tons are hoisted by these steam shovels and are dumped into the creek bottom to protect the grade, and it is believed that the work of repair being done this summer is permanent.

About 200 men are engaged in the permanent work is being done by the O. R. &N. on the mountain this season than ever before in one season.

Several trainloads will be hauled to the bridge west of the city to protect the grade from any future high wa


