BIG STONES HELP BRIDGES

An illustration of the important work of repair being done on the mountain by the O. R. & N. company was given to this city today when 29 carloads of stone, some of the massive pieces weighing four tons, passed through to be dumped into the Umatilla river at the steel bridge west of the city, says the Pendleton East Oregonian.

The steam shovel is located at Allen spur, 35 miles east of the city and there a half dozen work trains are engaged in hauling rock to fill in the washouts caused by last spring's high water. Rock weighing from one to four tons are hoisted by these steam shovels and are dumped into the creek bottom to protect the grade, and it is believed that the work of repair being done this summer is permanent.

About 200 men are engaged in the work of repairing the tracks and more permanent work is being done by the O. R. & N. on the mountain this season than ever before in one season.

Several trainloads will be hauled to the bridge west of the city to protect the grade from any future high water.

BAKER FANS COME SUNDAY

It is practically assured that the Sunday game of the series with Baker City will be witnessed by a large number of people from Baker City. The Baker City Herald says of the plans now on foot:

There is a plan on foot for an excursion to be run to La Grande next Sunday morning and return the same night so Baker people may see the ball game between the Nuggets and La Grande best pullers. It will take 25 to secure one and one-third rates to La Grande. Many of the fans want to take the band with them and there are 24 in this aggregation and would therefore make the excursion a go. The cost of taking the band would be about \$100 and the citizens of Baker would no doubt donate freely if asked. Perhaps tomorrow a committee will be selected for this work. The fare for the round trip will be \$2.10.
