NEW LIGHTS SATURDAY

CITY TO BE THE BEST
LIGHTED IN THE STATE.

Present System Not Perfect—Better Service Later on—Population Invited Down Town on Saturday Night to Hear the Band Play.

The additional incandescent lights which will give three blocks on Adams avenue and two blocks on Depot street brilliant illumination when lighted, will be turned on next Saturday night. The contract has been closed with the Grande Ronds Electric company, ample assurance that money for the payment of same will be forthcoming having been made. Though the lights will be turned on Saturday night for the first time, the system is not as perfect yet as it will be later. From time to time there will be improvements made in the new system of more lights and in a week's time the zig-zagging strings of incandescent street lights will give the business streets of La Grande the best illumination of any city in the state. The band will be out Saturday night and the entire population of the city is invited down town to witness the new lights. After this week there will be no more stumbling about in the half-lighted business streets, for the smaller lights will thoroughly illuminate the streets between the corners where arc lights are now hung.

BETTER PRESS SERVICE.

United Press Used by Observer is Extending Wires All Over Coast. The Oregon Daily Journal says of the extension and improvement of the United Press telegraphic service, which furnishes the telegraphic news of the La Grande Evening Observer: Growth of the United Press service in the west is exemplified in the extension of the Pacific coast leased wire to Vancouver, British Columbia. The coast wire now stretches from San Diego to British Columbia and has all the important coast cities on the circuit. From the Journal office in Portland the Journal and United Press operators can work direct with Los Angeles, San Diego, Fresno, San Francisco, Sacramento, Medford, Seattle, Tacoma, and Vancouver, B. C., and many other towns along the line. The United Press is conceded by such newspapers as the Indianapolis News, Baltimore American, New York Journal, Cleveland Press and Chicago Examiner to be the most up-to-date service in existence. It is gradually supplanting the old associations in all parts of the United States.
