If Both Applicants Pass the Examinations, the City Sub Carriership and the Coming Vacancy in the Postoffice Will Have Been Filled-Apparently Nothing to Hinder Delivery Service Now.

If the lone male applicant for a commission as substitute mail carrier in the city of La Grande passes the examination held before Assistant Secretary Mary Reisland of the civil tervice commission this afternoon, there is apparently nothing to hinder the inauguration of the free mail deust first. Last May, when the serv ice should have been put in force, it was postponed until August 1, for various reasons, one being that the "sub" carrier list was not complete. While there are other matters, such as proper repair of sidewalks, that may detain the service, it seems probable that this is the last month of the old system.

Two applicants-one a lady and the other a gentleman-took the civil service examination this afternoon The two applicants will fill the vacancles existing in the window clerk ship of the local office, and in the sub carrier list, provided, of course, that both pass. 
