FIERCE CHARGES.

Strong Allegations Set Forth in Divorce Petition Now on File.

That Baker county's divorce mill will have a case to deal with that will blacken the hopper and make cogwheels chug before it is ground out, is apparent from the petition filed by Mary L. Warner against Marlon R. Warner, her husband, says the Herald.

Postal laws and regulations prevent printing her charges in full. No Paris novel ever bristled with such reading for those who take to the "rich, rare and racy" as does the petition of this woman who seeks separation from a man who is father of her three children.

Among other things she charges a complete rupture and break of the marriage vows; that the defendant has punctured the bubble of connubial bliss in many ways, some of which are unlikened to humanity; that he has seen fit to associate with soiled doves; that he has been cruel and inhospitable to his own household, and failed to support those who according to law have a right to depend upon him.

For all these alleged outrages the woman asks the court to grant her absolute divorce and give her the custody of the three minor children.

Will Lift Water.

S. A. Pursel this week bought of O. P. Pratt, the implement and commission man of Union, a three-horse power Stover gasoline engine and a Jackson centrifugal pump, at a cost of \$325, to be used in lifting water from a 5 1/2 inch well, 154 feet deep, in which the water rises to within 14 feet of the surface. It is the design of Mr. Pursel to use this water for irrigation purposes on a 160-acre tract on the Sandridge.—Union Republican.
