### Barley Field Burns.

A live coal from a threshing engine on the Harry Collins farm one mile east of Valley Grove station, yesterday afternoon set fire to a field of barley belonging to Mr. Collins, and before the blaze could be extinguished 40 acres of barley out of a 120-acre field were entirely consumed, destroying more than 2000 bushels. The yield on this place was heavy, the barley averaging about 80 bushels an acre. A fire-fighting company of about 70 men was quickly organized when the alarm was given but it was more than an hour before any headway was gained against the flames. The separator and other parts of the threshing machine were not damaged.
