An arrangement which will greatly facilitate matters for patrons of the Evening Observer has been made with the Pacific Telephone company, and the new directories which will be distributed to subscribers in a day or two, are provided with The Observer arrangement. After tomorrow, the business department and the editorial and news department will each have its own telephone. Anyone having a news item or business with any member of the news staff, should call Main 13. To transact business matters of any description, the caller should call Main 13, two rings. The result will be that the business department will answer the telephone and the man at the other end will not be forced to a disagreeable wait while the department he seeks is being switched on the wire. Close adherence to this arrangement will facilitate matters for the one calling and for this office, as well.

SEEKS HEALTH IN SOUTH.

Bishop O'Reilly of Oregon, Sojourning in Northern California. A San Francisco special dispatch says: The Rt. Rev. Charles J. O'Reilly, Catholic bishop of eastern Oregon, arrived in this city today. He has been in northern California for a time, resting at the springs, and it is his intention to remain at St. Patrick's seminary, Menlo Park, with the hope of improving his health. Bishop O'Reilly has been bishop of Oregon since 1903, and previous to that year he had been coadjutor of the archbishop and held other offices in the diocese while a priest. He is compelled to seek rest and recuperation in the milder climate of California.

PENDLETON EDITOR DEAD.

Business Manager of Morning Tribune Dies at Walla Walla Yesterday. William F. Gulon, business manager of the Morning Tribune, died at Walla Walla this morning from the effects of diabetes. While full details concerning the funeral have not been learned, it is understood that the interment will be in one of the Walla Walla cemeteries, says the Pendleton Post Oregonian. For more than a year the deceased has been badly afflicted with kidney trouble and for months there had been but little hope of his recovery. A month or more ago his condition became critical and he was taken to St. Anthony's hospital. From there he was taken to a hospital at Walla Walla where he remained until his death.
