MASS MEETING POSTPONED

BOARD OF MANAGERS IN SESSION LAST NIGHT. Matter of Urging the O. R. & N. to Park Jefferson Avenue in the Rear of the Depot Taken Up by the Board Again—Discuss Irrigation Project—Consider Matter of Advertising in Foreign Fields—Many Boosters in Attendance.

At a meeting of the Commercial club last night a report was received on the irrigation project to the effect that the big financiers who are to put up the money for the installation of the plant were unable at this time to make the trip to La Grande on account of important business matters which must have their attention in the east. The delay will be temporary, however, and the outlook for the completion of the plans as laid out heretofore are better than they have ever been.

The big meeting of the fruit growers and farmers called for July 18, will be postponed until a definite date can be set, when it will be a certainty that the eastern parties can be here.

The board of managers of the Commercial club are well pleased at the promising condition of this big improvement project and feel that it is only a matter of a short time until a definite plan will be placed before the land owners for the complete irrigation of the entire valley. When that day comes, the future of this valley is assured, and no part of Oregon will boast of better agricultural resources or a more varied assortment of crops. The beauty of irrigation is, and every farmer in America is learning the fact, that water at hand for use as required, eliminates any possibility of crop failure. Not only that, but the yield is increased on everything grown. And the time will be here soon when the farmer in the Grande Ronde valley will be the most independent on earth.

Consider Advertising.
The Pacific Monthly Publishing company, which is printing the booklet, last night solicited an ad. from the publicity committee, and the matter was gone into at considerable length, both pro and con. It was finally decided to take this and similar propositions up at some future meeting and devote the entire session to the discussion of magazine and newspaper advertising. At that meeting the board of managers will decide on the extent of the advertising to be done in this manner, what publications to patronize and the amount of money that they will appropriate for this class of advertising.

Boosters in Arrears.
An examination of the treasurer's books discloses the fact that a considerable portion of the amounts subscribed to the booster fund remains unpaid, and those whose payments are in arrears are urged to be prompt in the matter. Quite a number of the club members have not paid their regular monthly dues, and as it is the desire of the managers to do away with the expense of a collector's salary, such members are earnestly requested to pay to George Cleaver, treasurer of the club, their dollar a month without further solicitation.

In fact, such a promise was made in the past. General Manager O'Brien, to whom Mr. Miller directed his letter, replied that the matter had been referred to Mr. Buckley. Mr. Buckley has not yet been heard from, but it is not expected that the railroad officials will hesitate to oblige the city. The present officials of the lines in Oregon have been very nice to the city in allowing the exhibit hall on their grounds, and there is no reason to believe that further favors will be withheld.

La Grande went dry June 1, but it was proven over one year ago that there is an abundance of pure, sparkling artesian water in less than 1000 feet below the surface. Why not have artesian city water?
