Mills Shut Down.
With over thirty million feet of manufactured lumber in the yards of the different sawmills in Baker City, and with the market dull and sluggish due to a pending presidential campaign and other causes, it is likely that the wharf of the sawmill will not be heard regularly throughout each day during the summer months.

Last Saturday night the large mill at Austin, owned by the Oregon Lumber company, was closed temporarily. It is not known how long this property will be idle, but indications for a steady run are not good.

The South Baker plant will close, the latter part of this week. It was intended to shut it down on the 15th, but there is doubt expressed whether the work on hand will be finished by that time. That it will close some time this week is practically certain.

Shockey & McMurren have not announced they will shut down, but they have a quantity of lumber on hand and unless business experiences a strong stimulant the belief exists that they, too, will lay off for a while. The same is true of Stoddard Bros.—Baker City Herald.
