cents per pound, which is 1/4 of a cent above the contract basis of last year. This means 5 cents per pound for the 40-50 grade, notwithstanding the glut in the market of all other varieties of canned and evaporated fruits. While the prune crop of the state will not come up to that of last year, the latest estimate being between 17,000,000 and 18,000,000 pounds as against 23,000,000 pounds last year, the quality will be par excellence, and the Oregon grower stands in a good way to realize a good profit for his product. Several years ago an experimental shipment of Oregon prunes was made to London, and met with such ready sale and gave such satisfaction that there has been an increasing demand for prunes each succeeding year.—Umpqua Valley Record.
