# LOW RATES THIS FALL

Though it is announced that low colonist rates will be in effect again this fall, during the months of September and October, the La Grande O. R. & N. office has not been advised of the fact. The head offices of the Harriman roads, however, announce that they have taken the initiative, and given notice to the interstate commerce commission that they will put in low rates during the months of September and October from all eastern territory, to Oregon and the Pacific northwest.

The rates will be the same as last spring, namely \$29 from Kansas City, Omaha, St. Paul, Minneapolis, and Missouri river territory; \$26.50 from St. Louis; \$28 from Chicago and adjacent territory.

All commercial bodies are expected to redouble their efforts during July and August to advertise Oregon in the eastern states. The middle west is one of the most responsive regions of the country, and all through Iowa, Nebraska, Kansas, Minnesota, Illinois, Missouri, Indiana and the Dakotas, the people are leding willing ears to tales of Oregon opportunity.

The Portland Chamber of Commerce has just issued 50,000 new booklets on Oregon, to be distributed in the east, and the demand for them is unparalleled. The supply from the printer is insufficient to keep pace with requests for the booklet. The Southern Pacific, O. R. & N., Northern Pacific and Great Northern have asked for large numbers of the book to be given out at eastern agencies of these companies to people who are inquiring about the Pacific Northwest.

All the Union county descriptive matter now under compilation and publication will be ready for distribution at that time, and the thousands who will no doubt swarm into Oregon during these two months will be acquainted with facts for which they seek in a manner never before possible in this county.
