# BIG CIRCUS IS COMING

Advertising car No. 1, of the Barnum & Bailey greatest show on earth, managed by Harry B. Graham, and with a force of 25 billposters, a boss and a pastemaker, is spending the day in the city spreading the news that the show is soon to exhibit here.

Frank J. O'Donnell, the contracting press agent of the circus, whose office is on car No. 1, was a caller during the day, and judging from his description of the show which the Barnum & Bailey management is this year presenting, there is no doubt that lovers of the circus form of amusement have a delightful treat in store. In the first place there will be a parade, much more elaborate than those of the past, having been built by foreign artists at the European shops of the show at Stoke-on-Trent, England.

And there will be a thriller such as was never dreamed of by the most morbid-minded shoot the chuter of past seasons. All this, together with an all-star European company of performers, an enlarged menagerie and an entire new equipment, gives promise of a circus day that cannot well be missed.

The advertising of this big circus is one of its most wonderful features.
