GLASSHOPPERS IN UMATILLA.

Farmers Are Alarmed Over Much Damage by Pests.

Some of the farmers in the vicinity of Pilot Rock have become very much alarmed over the damage being done by the grasshoppers this season, says a dispatch to the East Oregonian of Pendleton. They seem to be in spots, and in various places the second and third cuttings of alfalfa have been almost totally destroyed by them. They have not been known to be so bad for many years, and some declare it is on account of the dry season. Many of the gardens in this section have been almost entirely destroyed by the pests, and altogether the damage will be quite heavy. No material damage has yet been done in the immediate vicinity of Pilot Rock, but many complaints are coming in from a few miles out.

PENDLETON MILLS NOT SOLD.

Sale Not Consummated According to a Chief Stockholder in Company.

That he has heard nothing of the sale of the Pendleton woolen mill plant to the proposed textile concern of Portland, was declared this afternoon by E. E. Judd. At the present time E. Y. Judd is away from the city and if any deal for the woolen mill has been made, it has been made with him just recently. According to F. E. Judd, the woolen mill plant was appraised by the promoters of the Portland company and negotiations for the plant had been entered into. However, he has never heard of the trade being closed and is under the impression that the Portland people have not yet produced the payment for the plant.—Pendleton East Oregonian.

PENDLETON WILL HAVE WATER.

City Dads and Citizens Enthusiastically in Favor of New Water System.

Pendleton, July 27.—The water commission of the city council will hold a meeting early in August, and at that time will take up the vitally important matter of securing a new water supply from high up the Umatilla river. It will take at least a year from next November before the plan can be submitted to a vote of the taxpayers. An act of congress is necessary before right of way for the pipe line can be secured through the reservation, but the commission is determined to have all the preliminary work done long before that time.

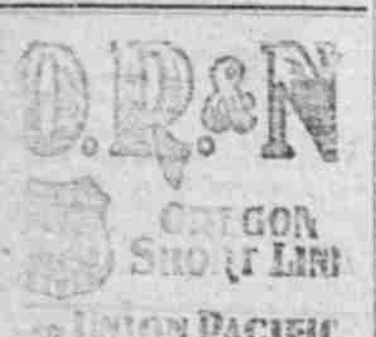
