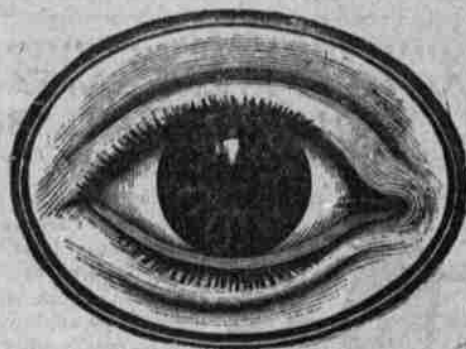

# COVE FAVORS CANNERY

CROPS GOOD, CHERRIES ARE FINE AND EVERYTHING O. K.

Dave Clark Now in La Grande After Cherry Boxes—Comments on Needs of Cannery in This Valley—Apple Crop is Likewise Promising This Year—Prosperity Smiles on Cove.

Dave Clark, the well known Cove merchant, is over in his auto today after cherry boxes. He states that crop conditions are very good this year. In some fields the wheat crop is short, but he expects the increased price over last year will bring the total volume up to the average. Mr. Clark has secured a great deal of fruit this year and has just finished a contract with a Portland cannery to take the cherry crop suitable for cannery purposes on a basis of \$50 per ton. Two of the largest growers contracted their crops last year, Messrs. Thomas and Stackland. They are fortunate, receiving \$80 per ton.

There is ample help to gather the crop. Grovers are paying 4 cents per gallon.

The apple crop at this time is also promising, both as to yield and quality.

Mr. Clark is in a position to realize the necessity of the establishment of a large cannery in this valley. At the present time there are hundreds of crates of raspberries drying on the vines of Cove growers from want of a market, and if there was a cannery the present acreage would be greatly increased.

This season Mr. Clark handled about two-thirds of the strawberry crop, amounting to \$3000 in all, and every grower made big money, averaging over \$2 per crate, f. o. b. Cove, and there was a market for any amount offered. The Cove, like the western portion of the valley, is not growing the amount of strawberries grown a few years ago. There is a fine opening for strawberry culture in this valley on a large scale.
