TWO TRAINS FOR PICNIC

CONDUCTORS' EXCURSION IS ASSURED BY MANAGER.

Two Trains, the First to Cross New Road, Will Take Conductors and the Public to Looking Glass for Basket Picnic—Big Event is on August 9.

Something great is in store for rail-road conductors, their families, and, in fact, the public, on August 9, when the proposed conductors' excursion will carry hundreds to the Looking Glass.

With the purpose in view of securing permission from the management of the O. R. & N., Messrs. H. C. Grady and T. E. Bushler went to Portland

the other day, returning this morning again. They found General Manager O'Brien willing to grant the request, and as a result, the brotherhood here is making preparations for the record-breaking picnic of the year. Nowhere in Wallowa county or in eastern Oregon on the O. R. & N., is there a place more suitable for a basket picnic than right on the Looking Glass—just past the Palmer junction—and here it is that two excursion trains of eight coaches each will be destined on August 9. The first train will leave about 7 o'clock and the second section a half hour later, according to present plans. However, exact leaving time will be announced in due time.

The First Train In.

These two excursion trains will be the first passenger trains to cross the newly laid steel into Wallowa county. The Looking Glass country is about 24 miles from La Grande and will afford a delightful trip for those who purchase tickets. The return trip tickets will be \$1. While all conductors that can possibly secure lay-offs on that day will attend with their families, the trainmen will not be all who will go, as the public is invited. That the public will avail itself of this splendid opportunity to spend a day in the heart of the mountains, is presupposed. Full announcement of schedule and final arrangements will be made in The Observer at a near date.
