HIGH PRICE FOR WHEAT

Pendleton, July 28.—With the opening price higher than ever before in the history of the county, this year's wheat crop is now being sold, and if the yield has been less than normal the price at least is highly satisfactory to the farmers. The opening price is 73 cents.

For several days past the wheat market has been active, although selling has not yet become general. Most of the wheat now sold changed hands Saturday, and nearly all of it was from the reservation. The largest sale that has yet occurred was that of L. L. Mann's yield, 35,000 bushels, to the Kerr-Gifford company. Aside from the Mann wheat, Frank Rogers, manager for the K.-G. company, also sold his yield. The Balfour-Guthrie company purchased the yield of Mr. Williamson, and the Byers mill has also bought some wheat. The wheat market this year opened at 72 cents for club, and immediately advanced to 73 cents. Buyers say they cannot remember of a higher opening price. Bluestem is selling at 76 to 77 cents.

The percentage of smutty wheat this year is larger than usual, and reports received show that this county, as well as practically the entire northwest is more or less damaged by smut this year. Wheat that is classed as smutty sells at from 3 to 15 cents per bushel lower than No. 1.

BOOSTERS IN HARNESS

Every passenger on the westbound train this morning was presented with boost literature, such as is at hand, and invited to grab a handful of Royal Annes which growers of the valley have supplied for the occasion. With the assistance of Clarence Wood, Ralph Jones and Ura Kirtley Jr., Messrs. Lavey and Benham, the latter of whom is noted for his boosting proclivities, were able to supply every passenger. The work was declared successful after the boosters had wiped the perspiration from their heated brows.

From Limbs Tomorrow.
The cherries distributed in bulk today were donated principally by J. B. Stoddard, and tomorrow U. G. Couch of Island City, will bring in a large branch well clustered with cherries. There will be more "picking fruit at the depot" tomorrow as a consequence.
