PRUITT BOUND CHICAGOWARD.

Missing Pendleton Newspaper Man
Hended for Windy City.

"Hello, Dad. Which way?"
Sitting in a day coach on the Spokane Flyer last Wednesday morning a week ago, bound for Spokane, and while the train was nearing Walla Walla, H. C. Willis was tapped on the shoulder and accosted as above by some one standing in the aisle and, upon looking around, saw W. C. E. Pruitt, says the Pendleton Tribune.
As they grasped hands Willis said: "Hello, Pruitt, where are you going?" "Off for Chicago," was the reply, and he went on, presumably, Willis says, and as he thought at the time, for the diner in quest of some breakfast.
Mr. Willis says he thought nothing more of the incident since a good many people go to Chicago, until yesterday morning, when he read in the Tribune a reference to his mysterious disappearance in an account of the return of Deputy District Attorney Ferguson. He at once came to this office and reported the above facts. He says Pruitt seemed very pleasant and was well dressed.

It has developed within the past two days that Pruitt recently told an intimate friend or two that he intended soon to go and see his daughter (by his first wife) who is living in Iowa, and whom he has not seen for several years. The supposition is that Pruitt bought a ticket at Pendleton last Tuesday night—a week ago—and took the Spokane flyer at Umatilla.

THRESHING MACHINES BURN.

Three Outfits Consumed by Fire in Umatilla County.

Three threshing machine fires have already occurred in Umatilla county this harvest season, and in view of the amount of smutty wheat this year other conflagrations are expected, relates the Pendleton East Oregonian.

The first machine to burn was that of Isaac Christopher, who has a ranch near Adams. The machine was running at the time and suddenly blew up. It then caught fire and was almost totally destroyed. No insurance was carried on the outfit.

Shortly after the Christopher fire, Frank Brotherton's machine caught fire and burned while traveling from one setting to another. The machine was near Vansycle, and the origin of the fire is a mystery. It was probably due to a spark from the engine or else carelessness on the part of some one in the threshing crew.

The Brotherton thresher was a steamer, and the loss was appraised at \$600. It was insured in the National Fire Insurance company, and W. A. Gelsley, agent for the company, was here at the time. He settled the loss today.

The third threshing machine fire was on the Hudeman place, near Helix, and details concerning the same are lacking.
