NAME SITE NEXT WEEK

An agent of the government is hurrying across the continent to pick sites for public buildings in cities of the west, and is due to arrive in Walla Walla early next week. After making his selections there, he will come to Pendleton to select the site for the government building provided for at that city. Then he comes to La Grande.

Just what his instructions are will then be made public. He will come here with recommendations from the head office and with his personal judgment, will select the site where La Grande's new federal building is to be stationed. This will in all probability be done sometime next week.

DELIVERY IS DELAYED

CARRIERS OUT, BUT NOT TO DELIVER MAIL.
First Delivery Will Probably Take Place Tuesday—Until Then Carriers Will Straighten Out the Two Routes.

A spectacle speaking of the rapid advancement of the city of La Grande was seen this morning when city mail carriers, attired in the conventional uniform, made a house to house canvass, to ascertain the exact addresses of those who wish to become patrons of the service. No mail was carried out by them today, however, and it is not likely that such will be the case until Tuesday at the earliest. Their work today consisted entirely in spreading small slips on which the resident owners will place full instructions to the carriers on the two routes.

Collected Mail Today.

The first collection of mail from the 19 mail boxes in the various parts of the city was made at 4 o'clock this afternoon. Two collections will be made daily hereafter, at 10 o'clock and at 4 in the afternoon.

Rapidly Adjusting Itself.
The intricate details of the service is rapidly adjusting itself, but prospective patrons can expedite matters much by leaving their order at the postoffice as to street addresses and the like.

The Routes.
Mr. Stoddard will carry in the business district. He has both sides of Adams avenue from its intersection with Fourth street. His territory extends from Fourth on Adams to the A. B. C. laundry, then northwest to the new brick school house, then north to Fourth street, then south to place of beginning.

Clinton Ball will carry everything south of Adams avenue. His territory is outlined by the foot of the hill commencing at Washington, Adams and Oak, two blocks west of First street, following the foot of the hill until it reaches the Turner Oliver home on Fourth, then south to the court house, and east to a line with the flouring mill, taking practically all the homes in East La Grande.
