LOCAL GAME WARDEN HERE

The bird laws in Union county will open on August 15, and already gunmen are preparing for the big day. With the announcement comes one which is anything but pleasing, and that is that many are hunting this season without the proper license. The records at the court house bear out this statement. It is not right that this should be the case. In touching upon this undesirable feature of the violation of the laws, the Union Republican has this to say:

The "Sooner" Sportsman.
"If current reports are true, there is need of more active work on the part of the fish and game warden's office in the Grande valley. The bang-bang of shotguns along the streams and lakes, and in the hills indicate that the "sooner" sportsman is abroad in the land and is picking off young ducks and grouse before the open season has arrived. It is difficult to apprehend such law-breakers, but where respect for the law does not prevent the destruction of young game out of season, there ought to be a way of enforcing the law, and it is within the province of the game warden's office to do so. Just at this time in the year, of all others, the strict enforcement of the game law is important. The "sooner" hunter is not the true sportsman."

Local Warden Soon.
In response to the just criticism made by the Union paper, it is announced today that by the time the bird laws are open, a game warden will be appointed in La Grande. Application has already been made for the appointment, and his certificate will be issued in due time to enforce the game laws when the season opens. The warden's identity will be kept secret as much as possible, that the violators of the law will not have an opportunity of dodging him. It is safest to procure a hunting license. It may be costly not to.
