PLACE OFFICE AT UNION

The Western Union Telegraph company has a small crew of men at work today constructing a loop from the Union Junction to the station of the Oregon Central at Union, where a Western Union office is to be fitted up, a manager installed, and the city of Union put in direct communication with the rest of the world without the inconveniences of telephone service.

This scheme has been in process of maturing for several weeks, but it was not until yesterday that the crew was put to work. The office of the Western Union will be found in the Oregon Central depot at Union when it is fitted up. Lineman Donovan expects to have the loop completed by next Wednesday evening and after that time the citizens of Union will enjoy the facilities afforded by the company. Heretofore all business has been telephoned to the junction.

STEAL SALMON FROM FISH TRAP

TAKE 2000 SALMON AND ALLOW 25,000 TO ESCAPE.

Armed Pirates Overpower Guard at Fish Traps and Take Away Five Thousand Fish Valued at 40 Cents Each—Trap Left Down and 25,000 More Salmon Escape—Watchman Attempted to Use His Gun, But Was Overpowered.

Bellingham, Aug. 1.—Two armed pirate last night rowed up to the fish trap of the Alaska Packers association south of Point Roberts, disarmed the watchman with a revolver, bound and gagged him, leaving him in the trap. They decamped with 5000 salmon, which they loaded on two scows.

The plunder, at current price, 40 cents per salmon, is worth \$2000. The marauders left the trap open and allowed 25,000 additional salmon to escape. The watchman states the men rowed to the trap in a dory, and on his noticing them, ordered him to throw up his hands. When he attempted to use his gun, the weapon was taken from him and he was then bound. The watchman was held until released this morning by the crew of a tug.

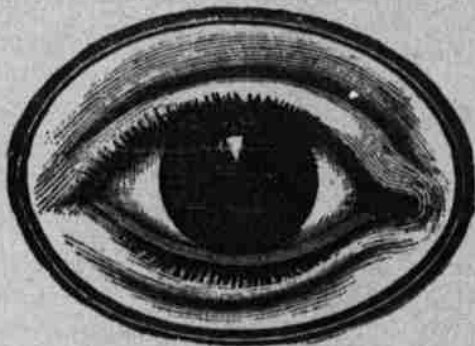
