### WHERE IS AGENT?

Cities Interested Lose Track of Man Who Picks Building Sites.

Where is the special agent from the Washington postal department who is to locate the site of the federal building in this city? That is the question which is bothering all the cities of Idaho, Washington and Oregon that have been promised new buildings. Mail has been received by Postmaster Hickey for the agent. As the mail was forwarded here from Walla Walla, it is indicative that he is coming to La Grande before he goes to Pendleton and Walla Walla. In the Garden City, however, announcement was made yesterday that he is coming there first, but that his trip has been delayed and that he will not reach there until an early day next week. As no one here knows exactly where the gentleman is, he may drop in to La Grande at any time.

### Prohibition Killing Pendleton (?)

Between 30 and 40 carpenters and brick masons are now employed in this city on the various buildings under construction. The largest force of brick masons and carpenters is employed on the city hall, which is rapidly nearing completion.

The new concrete block garage being erected on Johnson street by the Pendleton Auto company, is now being pushed along rapidly, and a considerable force is employed there by Boothby & Hale, the contractors.

Work on the new Episcopal rectory on Johnson street, is also progressing rapidly, the stone foundation and basement being about complete. G. I. LaDow is the contractor and will employ a considerable force of men on the building.

Contractor Dunlap is finishing an elegant cottage for C. S. Terpening on Tustin street, and plans are now under way for the McNabb cottage on East Court street. Numerous repairs and additions have been made to dwelling houses during the summer and, taken all through, it has been one of the best summer seasons experienced in the building line for several years.—Pendleton East Oregonian.

### DEFENSE UNDECIDED.

Huntington Murderer Still in Jail Without a Hearing.

W. R. Trapp, who shot and killed Slim Jaspersen in the Club saloon at Huntington one night last week, still occupies a cell at the county jail, and there has been no preliminary examination held, relates the Baker City Herald. This has been partially due to the absence of District Attorney Levens and partially to the defense who did not seem in any hurry for the preliminary to take place.

In the meantime there has been much conjecture as to what the line of defense will be. Charles Hyde, attorney for Trapp, naturally will not discuss that phase of the case. Today, however, Trapp's father and uncle arrived from the east. P. L. Trapp, his father, came from Graham, Mo., and W. E. Trapp, an uncle, came from Pocatello.

It is expected with the arrival of these two men, that some line of defense will be soon agreed upon and that the preliminary will shortly take place.

### Masons Honor Washington.

Fredericksburg, Va., Aug. 5.—A movement to secure funds for the erection of the Masonic memorial temple to George Washington has been started by the local lodge of Masons. The Father of His Country was made a Mason by the Fredericksburg lodge in 1752. The Bible used in the lodge when Washington was given his degrees and the records of the lodge, signed by the greatest of Americans, are still in existence. Masons all over the country will be asked to contribute to the memorial fund.

A small structure was built in the local railroad yards today, which will house the new hose cart which the O. R. & N. recently sent here. The miniature fire house and equipment will give ample fire protection to railroad buildings and property in the yards.
