A SIREN NEEDED. O. R. & N. Willing to Have Siren Attached to Steam Boilers.

That the present fire alarm system is a failure, becomes more and more evident. It is time the city took some steps to provide a more adequate alarm system—a step that could be taken at a very small cost. The O. R. & N. officials have already signified their willingness to allow the attachment of a siren at the power house in the lo-

cal place. This is a very important steam in that building, and a fire at any time of day or night could be given proper alarm by the sounding of the siren. Such an instrument could be heard far beyond the city limits. With a strong wind blowing, the present alarm system can be heard but a few blocks in the directions from whence the wind comes.
