BETTER CARE, LESS VINEGAR.

Scientific fruit canning in any community brings to discussion two essential features, namely: Is a vinegar factory a paying adjunct to a fruit cannery, and is a cannery itself an expensive industrial development to perfect?

The general consensus of opinion among those who are well-versed in fruit-growing culture and harvesting, replies to the first question in the negative.

Receipts would be larger, evidently, if he had a higher graded crop at harvest time, though less of it, than if he had a greater number of bushel and a larger percentage fit only for the vinegar factory.

Relative to the second phase of the cannery business: The establishment is not an expensive one. A \$5000 factory in the Grande Ronde valley would be adequately capable of handling the output here.
