### EVELYN HEAVY LOSER.

Harry Thaw's Bankruptcy Will Reduce Her Income Materially.  
Pittsburg, Pa., Aug. 8.—It was learned today that Evelyn Thaw will be the heaviest loser through the action of Harry in asking that he be declared a bankrupt. This means that her allowance will be cut down at least a thousand dollars monthly. It is intimated by friends of the Thaw family today that Thaw was actuated in filing the application by a desire to free himself from the constant demands for money from Evelyn. His assets are \$128,012.30, and his liabilities \$453,140.42.

### EIGHT DROWN IN LAKE.

Boat on Lake Winnipeg Burns, Causing Death of Eight People.  
Winnipeg, Aug. 8.—Dispatches today confirm the report that the steamer Premier, one of the largest boats on Lake Winnipeg, was wrecked on a reef near Warren's Landing Thursday, resulting in the death of six passengers and two members of the crew. Fire broke out in the engine room and spread rapidly preventing the passengers from manning the life boat. It burned to the water's edge. Two were killed below decks. Many jumped overboard and swam ashore.

Winnipeg, Man., Aug. 8.—The Canadian Pacific officials today stated that they will fulfill their promise to replace the strikers on the road in short order. A few more men were put to work today in partial fulfillment of this promise.
