NO FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS.

Delay in Transmitting Instructions is Responsible for Uncertainty.

Arrangements for the funeral of the late Abraham Eades, who died in Spokane yesterday, are still unsettled. The body was held at Spokane to await instructions from La Grande people, but a delay in delivery is responsible for the instructions not reaching Spokane until this morning at a time when it was too late to get the body off on the morning train. As a result it is not likely that the remains will arrive here tonight. In the event that they should, the funeral will be held from the church tomorrow forenoon. Local friends of the deceased are undecided today as to whether or not the funeral will be held tomorrow morning in the event that the remains come in on the morning train from Spokane.
