TAFT AN EASY WINNER

BRYAN DEFEATED BY 141 ELECTORAL VOTES.

Local Politicians Figure Out How the Electoral Vote Will Stand When the Presidential Election is Over—Bryan Vote Will Be 141 Behind According to Conservative Estimate.

William Jennings Bryan is a goner. La Grande prognosticators have compiled a table which is based on figures and conservative estimates as to how each state will "go" on presidential election day, and the result is that Bryan will be defeated by William H. Taft, the republican, by at least 141 electoral votes.
