## YANKEE TEAM IS OUTCLASSED

AUCKLAND MARKSMEN DE-  
FEATED AMERICAN TEAM.

Technical Invasion of British Province  
Made Today When American Rifle  
Team Landed With Arms—Law  
Forbidding This Temporarily Sus-  
pended—Officers of Fleet Meet the  
Usual Open-Hearted Reception—A  
Great Day for the Sailors.

Auckland, Aug. 12.—The Auckland  
rifle team today defeated the Ameri-  
can marksmen from the fleet by a  
margin of 65 points.

In order that the Americans might  
compete, the law against permitting  
armed bodies of foreigners to land on  
British soil, on the ground that it con-  
stitutes a technical invasion, was sus-  
pended. The American team was pre-  
sented with a handsomely engraved  
silver cup as a consolation prize.

Today is Jackie's day here. The of-  
ficers of the fleet are still at Boturua  
and no street car company is accept-  
ing money from them. They are ad-  
mitted free to all theaters and other

Authorities Have Man Who Posed as

Los Angeles, Aug. 12.—Accused of  
impersonating Lieutenant Commander

recruiting station here, Arthur Lack  
is in prison in Salt Lake City, accord-  
ing to advices received here. Lack is  
also accused of forging the name of  
his brother Fred and issuing an al-  
leged bogus United States treasury  
certificate. It is charged that while on  
his way to Utah he announced himself  
as "Perry G. Olmstead, U. S. A."

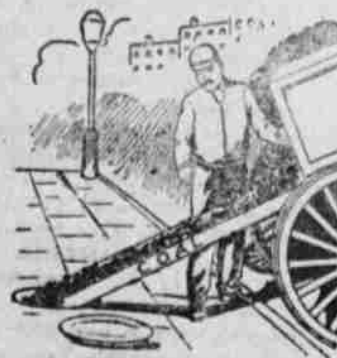
