There were over 200 representative men from every county in the state present, which shows that the question of improved highwave is receiving careful consideration

mittee to prepare a bill to be introduced in the next legislature to secure a state approrplation of \$10,000 for each county for a period of 10 years, providing the counties make a similar appropriation for road work and for the appointment of a state road supervisor to see that this work is properly executed.

Nearly every county in the state is making arrangements to conduct a campaign which will result in permanent work. That is, the road work may be consolidated so that the work which is done will be of a permanent nature and not a mere skimming over the entire county with the result that the entire road fund is practically wasted year in and year-out. This has been the policy all over the state for a number of years and of necessity could not have been otherwise during the early settlement of the counties. but the time is now at hand when work of a more permanent nature can be inaugurated.
