INSPECTOR HERE SUNDAY

Late yesterday evening Postmaster G. M. Richey received a telegram from J. H. McDowell, government selector of federal building sites—who is now at Pocatello—that he will reach here Sunday morning and proceed to make his choice of selections for sites upon which will stand the federal building that is soon to add to the city's appearance and up-to-dateness. Pocatello was one of the western cities that were fortunate enough to secure building appropriations at the last session of congress. Having now made his selection there, he comes to La Grande, when intended here he will pick a site for each Pendleton, Eugene and Walla Walla. The agent will walk into a hornets' nest when he reaches La Grande, for bids for sites has been brisk and competitive. By Monday evening, if the agent's selections are made public at once, The Observer will tell its readers where the \$65,000 federal building is to be located.

KRUTTSCHNITT AT PENDLETON.

With Other O. R. & N. Officials Calls on Employees in Pendleton.

Julius Kruttschnitt, vice-president and general manager of all the Harriman lines and director of maintenance and operation of a large part of the mileage of the Harriman systems, was a guest of Pendleton Thursday evening, says the Pendleton East Oregonian.

Mr. Kruttschnitt arrived from Portland at 3:30 yesterday afternoon on a special train of three cars, in company with General Superintendent M. J. Buckley and Chief Engineer G. W. Boschke of the O. R. & N. system, and left after a brief stay here for Starbuck on a tour of inspection of the lines.

Mr. Kruttschnitt is next to E. H. Harriman and is one of the best posted and most practical railroad men in the United States and is one of the strong men in the Harriman cabinet of managers. He looks after the maintenance and operation of a large part of the 11,000 miles of Harriman systems and is personally familiar with every division of that vast mileage.

Mr. Kruttschnitt is now 55 years of age and has devoted the greater part of his life to railroad work. He is a most affable man to meet, and while his responsibilities and work are of immense magnitude, yet he has time to meet and talk with the employees and get in touch with the departments by actual contact.
