They Would Hear Parker.

Democratic enthusiasm is being kindled in Umatilla county this week by the report that Judge Alton B. Parker is to speak in Portland next Tuesday night, and efforts are being put forth to secure a special coach to be joined to No. 2 next Tuesday morning, says the Tribune. Letters are being received from democrats in Milton, Weston, Athena, Helix and other parts of the county, expressing great interest in the project, so that the originators of the movement feel confident of success.

If a special coach should be secured, it is practically certain that reduced rates will be granted by the railroad for the occasion. From present indications prospects are good for a delegation of 50 or 60 from this county.

50,000 BOXES INCREASE.

Freewater-Milton Fruit Orchards Will Yield Excellent Crop.

Walla Walla, Aug. 14.—Although in point of quality the apple crop of this valley will not be much greater than that of last year the excellent quality of the fruit for 1908 will have a tendency to boost prices and cause a demand. Figures of railroad officials show that last year's product aggregated 450,000 boxes, about half that amount having been shipped.

The estimate for this year is placed considerably higher, and in the neighborhood of 500,000 boxes will be harvested. Fruitgrowers have paid special attention to spraying this season and as a result one of the finest crops ever seen in this section will soon be ready for pickers. This valley shipped 50 carloads more fruit last season than did the famed Yakima valley.

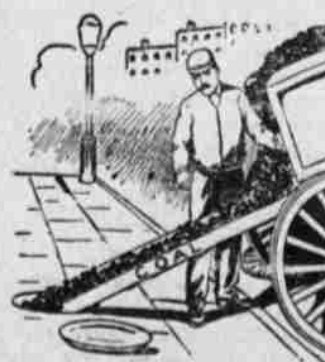
