MANUAL ARTS IN BAKER CITY

PUBLIC SCHOOL TAKES MUCH-NEEDED STEPS.

Baker City Schools Have Found It Impractical to Conduct Public Schools Without Manual Training—Train the Mind and Hand Simultaneously.

The Baker City public schools have grasped the importance of manual training in connection with the regular school curriculum. The directors have seen where the best education is that received by training the mind and hand simultaneously. In speaking of the highly commendable step taken by that city, the Baker Herald says:

The first city in Oregon outside of Portland, to install a manual training department in the public schools, is Baker City. The board of education of this city has contracted with Prof. J. N. McNeal of Menominee, Wis., to take up the manual training department in the Baker schools and his arrival is now daily expected.

Benefits to be derived from the additions to institutions of learning here cannot be estimated, so great are they. It has been Superintendent Churchill's one wish for some time to add manual training to the course, and he is pleased to be able to put his ideas in force along this line this year.

The old gymnasium will be used for the training department and will be equipped with electric power, circular saws, planers and also all sorts of wood-working tools. Besides this, it will be possible for mechanical drawing to be taught students who have an ambition to enter the mechanical world.

GETS MAN AT NAMPA.

Sheriff Taylor Nabs Bogus Check Man and Maybe Horse thief.

Sheriff Taylor of Umatilla county, passed through La Grande last Saturday evening with Asa Van Winkle, who cashed checks to the amount of \$93 in Pilot Rock, two weeks ago, and made good his escape, going through the mountains by Ukiah and Sumpter, and landing finally at Nampa, Idaho, where he was picked up by the chief of police at that place.

Van Winkle said that he turned the horse loose at Auburn, about nine miles from Baker, thinking that he was within two miles of the city. The country had been covered with descriptions of the man as far as Salt Lake city, and the Nampa police arrested him after recognizing his features by the descriptions sent out by Sheriff Taylor.

Two charges may be lodged against him, that of horse stealing, and of cashing bogus checks. This has not been fully decided upon, however, by the authorities here.

New Sewer System.

Baltimore, Md., Aug. 17.—Bids were received until noon today for \$1,000,000 of the new sewerage bonds, a part of a total authorized loan of \$10,000,000 for constructing a new sewerage system in Baltimore.

Numbering Progressing.

Allen Webb, who is revising the house numbers in the city, is again at work, the numbers having arrived after long delay. He has completed the business section and is now working out in the residence portions. He finds a large percentage of the house numbers substantially correct, but when he has completed his work the entire city will be perfectly numbered.
